Saturday:	Bathrooms = 75¢ each

Luke 4:1-13—Jesus in the wilderness

Day 1

Luke 4: 1-2

The biblical concept of satan is actually closer to an investigator or an accuser than an "evil person." Is being investigated always a negative experience? Can it be a positive one? How can it be helpful for us?

Day 2

Luke 4:3-4

See Deut. 8:3. It is the word of God that feeds our souls and our relationship with God and one another. What is a favorite Bible verse or story that feeds your relationship with God?

Day 3

Luke 4: 5-8

See Deut. 6:13. We have many voices in our lives asking us to "worship" them: jobs, money, possessions, etc. But it is God's voice alone we follow in our lives. What would your life be like if you followed all of your wants and desires and not God's voice?

Day 4

Luke 4: 9-12

See Deut. 6:16. Jesus has answered each of the tests by the devil with scripture about the reality of the world and God in our lives. How do we keep our callings, goals, and hopes in balance with following God?

Day 5

Luke 4: 1-13

While this "test" of Jesus is apparently over, everyday we have the opportunity to live our lives in a way that proclaims the reality and the love of God. What are ways that you can live your daily life as a follower of God?
