## Objective

The objective of the game Yahtzee is to make certain combinations out of five dice to generate a score as high as possible. Each turn a player gets to throw the dice three times and the player can decide what scoring combination to use for the round.

You can play yourself or against one or two other players. The game will keep track of your accumulated score in a scoreboard.

## Starting a Game

A new game is started by pressing space in the main screen. You will be prompted to select the number of players and enter their names. When the player information is entered, the game will start.



## Controls

When it is your turn, you will roll the dice one at the time by pressing the any key on the keyboard. Once all dice are thrown you will have the option to keep one or more dice and throw the remaining dice again. You start the second throw by pressing the space key, which will start rolling the dice.

It is recommended to not use the enter or space key to stop each dice since because these keys have different functionality and the player could accidentally make an action that is not intended.

Once you have rolled the dice three times you will need to enter the combination you choose to save in the scoreboard. You will do this by moving the arrow using the cursor keys to the scoreboard and press the enter key.

## Rules

The scoreboard is divided into two sections. The upper section contains boxes, which are scored by the sum of the dice faces matching the number of the box. If the sum of all boxes in the upper section is 63 or higher, the player is awarded a bonus of 35 points.

The lower section contain poker style combinations that gives the player specific number of points. The different combinations are

**Three of a kind** – score sum of all dice

**Four of a kind** – score sum of all dice

**Full house** – score 25 points

**Small straight** – score 30 points

**Large straight** – score 40 points

**Yahtzee (five of a kind)** – score 50 points

**Chance** – score sum of all dice

If a player scores more than one Yahtzee, he is rewarded an additional 100 point bonus for each Yahtzee.
